## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## Public High Schools - Graduation Requirements - Weighted Numerical Assessment System

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education to establish a certain weighted numerical assessment system to calculate a certain score that certain students are required to achieve to graduate from certain schools; requiring a certain assessment system to include certain categories that may not be outside certain ranges of certain percentage values of a certain total score; and generally relating to an assessment system for calculating achievement of high school graduation requirements.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Education

7-205.
(a) [The] ExCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE promotion of students in a public school and graduation from a public high school shall be in accordance with:
(1) Policies established by the county board; and
(2) The rules and regulations of the State Board.
(B) (1) The State Board shall establish a weighted NUMERICAL ASSESSMENT SYSTEM TO CALCULATE A TOTAL SCORE THAT STUDENTS SHALL ACHIEVE TO GRADUATE FROM A PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL IN THE STATE.
(2) (I) THE ASSESSMENT SYSTEM REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE CATEGORIES FOR EXAMINATIONS OR ASSESSMENTS, ATTENDANCE, AND GRADE POINT AVERAGE.
(II) THE TOTAL WEIGHTED VALUE OF THE CATEGORY FOR EXAMINATIONS OR ASSESSMENTS MAY NOT BE LESS THAN $50 \%$ AND NOT MORE THAN $\mathbf{6 0 \%}$ OF THE TOTAL SCORE REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION.
(III) THE TOTAL WEIGHTED VALUE OF THE CATEGORY FOR ATTENDANCE MAY NOT BE LESS THAN $\mathbf{1 0 \%}$ AND NOT MORE THAN $20 \%$ OF THE TOTAL SCORE REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION.
(IV) THE TOTAL WEIGHTED VALUE OF THE CATEGORY FOR GRADE POINT AVERAGE SHALL BE THE REMAINDER OF THE TOTAL SCORE THAT IS NOT CALCULATED BASED ON EXAMINATIONS OR ASSESSMENTS OR ATTENDANCE.
(3) A TOTAL SCORE OF 60 OR ABOVE CALCULATED UNDER THE ASSESSMENT SYSTEM REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE CONSIDERED A PASSING SCORE.
[(b)](C) (1) Each student who graduates from a public high school shall receive the same type of diploma or certificate, regardless of the high school attended or the course taken.
(2) The diploma or certificate shall state that the student has completed a program of studies satisfactorily in accordance with the requirements of the State Board.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
