SENATE BILL 958

1 (a) Before a public body advertises for bids or proposals for a public work 2 contract, it shall request the Commissioner to determine the prevailing wage rate for 3 each classification of worker required to perform the public work contract.

- 4 (c) After a determination has been made, the public body shall include each 5 prevailing wage rate for straight time and overtime:
- 6 (1) in any call for bids or proposals;
 7 (2) in the specifications for the public work contract; and
 8 (3) in the public work contract.

10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, each contractor and 11 subcontractor under a public work contract shall pay not less than the prevailing wage 12 rate of straight time to an employee for each hour that the employee works.

(b) A contractor and subcontractor shall pay an employee the prevailing
wage rate of overtime for each hour that the employee works:

- 15 (1) in excess of 10 hours in any single calendar day;
- 16 (2) in excess of 40 hours per each workweek; or
- 17 (3) on Sunday or a legal holiday.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 October 1, 2008.
