A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Homeowner's Insurance – Assignment of Policy on Sale of Property

FOR the purpose of authorizing the policyholder under a homeowner's insurance policy to assign the policy to the purchaser of the property that is covered by the policy; requiring that an assignment made under this Act be in writing; requiring the purchaser of the property to send a copy of the contract of assignment to the insurer within a certain time after assignment; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to homeowner's insurance.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(A) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION IN A HOMEOWNER'S
 INSURANCE POLICY THAT PROHIBITS THE ASSIGNMENT OF THE POLICY OR
 OTHERWISE LIMITS THE POLICYHOLDER'S RIGHT TO ASSIGN THE POLICY, THE
 POLICYHOLDER, ON SALE OF THE PROPERTY THAT IS COVERED BY THE POLICY,
 MAY ASSIGN THE POLICY TO THE PURCHASER OF THE PROPERTY.

23(2)AN ASSIGNMENT MADE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE IN24WRITING.

(B) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE ASSIGNMENT OF A HOMEOWNER'S
 INSURANCE POLICY UNDER SUBSECTION(A) OF THIS SECTION, THE PURCHASER
 OF THE PROPERTY THAT IS COVERED BY THE POLICY SHALL SEND A COPY OF
 THE CONTRACT OF ASSIGNMENT TO THE INSURER BY FIRST-CLASS MAIL.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply only 6 to homeowner's insurance policies issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or 7 after the effective date of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2008.
