#### Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Drive-Through Purchase Facilities

This bill prohibits the Board of License Commissioners in Prince George's County from issuing any new alcoholic beverages license of any class for use in a drive-through purchase facility.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2008 and applies only prospectively to licenses issued after the effective date.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** None. This bill would not impact drive-through facilities that already hold an alcoholic beverages license. Future license fee revenues would not be affected because license fees for establishments with drive-through windows are the same for establishments without these facilities.

**Small Business Effect:** Potential minimal.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** There is no law in Prince George's County permitting or prohibiting the Board of License Commissioners from transferring or issuing an alcoholic beverages license for use at a drive-through purchase facility.

**Background:** Other counties, including Cecil, Frederick, and Harford, prohibit the transfer of certain alcoholic beverages licenses for use at a drive-through purchase facility. The Board of License Commissioners in Prince George's County advises there are currently 40 drive-through purchase facilities in the county that hold an alcoholic beverages license.
