Environment - Phosphorus - Dishwashing Detergent

This bill delays by six months – from January 1, 2010 to July 1, 2010 – the effective date of the prohibition on using, selling, manufacturing, or distributing detergent for use in a household dishwashing machine that contains more than 0.5% phosphorus by weight.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not materially affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: The bill would not materially affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapters 187 and 188 of 2007 prohibit, beginning January 1, 2010, a person from using, selling, manufacturing, or distributing for use or sale within the State any detergent for use in a household dishwashing machine that contains more than 0.5% phosphorus by weight.

Background: The Soap and Detergent Association (SDA) and the Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers advise that the detergent industry has committed to developing and marketing a phosphate-free alternative by July 1, 2010. According to the industry, this bill will make the effective date of Maryland's prohibition consistent with that of several other states that have enacted or are considering similar prohibitions. SDA advises that of all the states that have enacted statewide prohibitions on the use of dishwashing detergent that contains phosphorus, only Maryland's prohibition has an

effective date other than July 1, 2010. Legislative Services notes, however, that in the state of Washington, the ban is scheduled to take effect in three counties on July 1, 2008.

Although several household phosphate-free dishwashing detergents are currently available, SDA believes that they represent less than 1% of the market.
