FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Revised

House Bill 957 (Delegate V. Clagett)

Health and Government Operations Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

State Government - Commemorative Days - Maryland Charter Day and Annapolis Charter Day

This bill requires the Governor to proclaim June 20 as Maryland Charter Day and December 17 as Annapolis Charter Day.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2008.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Commemorating Maryland Charter Day and Annapolis Charter Day would not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Four official commemorative days and two months are recognized in State law as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. armed forces.

Background: King Charles I granted Cecelius Calvert, the second Lord Baltimore, a charter for the Maryland Colony on June 20, 1632. On November 22, 1633, the Ark and

the Dove sailed for America with almost 200 settlers on board. On March 25, 1634, Lord Calvert and his group of English settlers landed on St. Clement's Island, marking the official origin of Maryland. This year (2008) will mark the three hundred seventy-sixth anniversary of the granting of the Maryland charter by King Charles I.

Maryland Day is celebrated on March 25 each year to commemorate the landing of the first English settlers.

On November 22, 1708, the residents of Annapolis received a Royal Charter from Queen Anne of Great Britain that granted them powers of self-government. On December 17, 1708, the General Assembly confirmed and codified Annapolis' chartered powers of self-government, making Annapolis the first incorporated municipality in Maryland. The three-hundredth anniversary of the granting of the city's original charter is 2008.
