- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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2 (M) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 21–209 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IF NO 3 LIGHTED INDICATION IS VISIBLE TO A DRIVER APPROACHING A TRAFFIC 4 CONTROL SIGNAL, THE DRIVER SHALL REDUCE SPEED AND PREPARE TO YIELD 5 TO OTHER VEHICLES IN OR APPROACHING THE INTERSECTION.

6 [(m)] (N) Except for those provisions of this section that by their very nature 7 cannot apply, this section applies to a traffic control signal placed at a location other 8 than an intersection. Each stop required by the signal shall be made at a sign or 9 marking on the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made or, if there is no 10 sign or marking, at the signal.

Vehicular traffic approaching a highway from an exit ramp from an expressway,
as defined in § 21–101(k) of this title, and facing a nonfunctioning traffic control signal
at the intersection of the exit ramp and the highway shall:

15(1) Stop: At a clearly marked stop line; 16 (i) If there is no clearly marked stop line, before entering any 17(ii) 18 crosswalk; or 19 (iii) If there is no crosswalk, before entering the highway; and 20 (2)Remain stopped until it is safe to continue onto the highway. 21SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22October 1, 2009.
