A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – Impervious Surface – Statewide Database**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment, in consultation
4 with the Department of Planning, to develop and maintain a database of
5 impervious surface in the State; requiring a county to report the amount of its
6 impervious surface to the Department of the Environment in a certain manner;
7 authorizing the Department of the Environment to adopt certain regulations;
8 defining a certain term; and generally relating to impervious surface in the
9 State.

10 BY adding to

11 Article – Environment

12 Section 9–1623

13 Annotated Code of Maryland

14 (2007 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Environment**

18 **9–1623.**

19 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, “IMPERVIOUS SURFACE” INCLUDES:

20 (I) STRUCTURES, BUILDINGS, DWELLING UNITS, ROADS,
21 PARKING LOTS, DRIVEWAYS; AND

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 **(II) AREAS THAT ARE COVERED WITH GRAVEL, STONE,**
2 **SHELL, IMPERMEABLE DECKING, PAVERS, OR ANY OTHER IMPERVIOUS**
3 **MATERIAL.**

4 **(2) "IMPERVIOUS SURFACE" DOES NOT INCLUDE:**

5 **(I) A FENCE OR WALL THAT IS LESS THAN 1 FOOT IN WIDTH**
6 **THAT HAS NOT BEEN CONSTRUCTED WITH A FOOTER;**

7 **(II) A WOOD MULCH PATHWAY; OR**

8 **(III) A DECK WITH GAPS TO ALLOW WATER TO PASS FREELY.**

9 **(B) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF**
10 **PLANNING, SHALL DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN A DATABASE OF IMPERVIOUS**
11 **SURFACE IN THE STATE.**

12 **(C) EACH COUNTY SHALL REPORT THE AMOUNT OF ITS IMPERVIOUS**
13 **SURFACE TO THE DEPARTMENT IN A MANNER AND ACCORDING TO A SCHEDULE**
14 **DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT.**

15 **(D) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS**
16 **SECTION.**

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 2009.
