A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws - Reduction of Speed Limits by Local Authorities - Engineering**
3 **and Traffic Investigations**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county, municipality, or other public body that has
5 the authority to enact laws and adopt local police regulations relating to traffic
6 to decrease a certain maximum speed limit in a business district or a residential
7 district to not less than a certain speed without conducting an engineering and
8 traffic investigation; and generally relating to the reduction of speed limits.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article - Transportation**

22 21-801.1.

23 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the maximum speed limits
24 are:

- 1 (1) 15 miles an hour in alleys in Baltimore County;
- 2 (2) 30 miles an hour on:
- 3 (i) All highways in a business district; and
- 4 (ii) Undivided highways in a residential district;
- 5 (3) 35 miles an hour on divided highways in a residential district;
- 6 (4) 50 miles an hour on undivided highways in other locations; and
- 7 (5) 55 miles an hour on divided highways in other locations.

9 (a) (1) **[If SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IF,** on
 10 the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a local authority determines that
 11 any maximum speed limit specified in this subtitle is greater or less than reasonable
 12 or safe under existing conditions on any part of a highway in its jurisdiction, it may
 13 establish a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit for that part of the highway,
 14 which may:

- 15 (i) Decrease the limit at an intersection;
- 16 (ii) Increase the limit in an urban district to not more than 50
 17 miles an hour;
- 18 (iii) Decrease the limit in an urban district; or
- 19 (iv) Decrease the limit outside an urban district to not less than
 20 25 miles an hour.

21 (2) An engineering and traffic investigation is not required to
 22 **[conform]:**

23 (I) **CONFORM** a posted maximum speed limit in effect on
 24 December 31, 1974, to a different limit specified in § 21-801.1(b) of this subtitle; **OR**

25 (II) **DECREASE A MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT IN A BUSINESS**
 26 **DISTRICT OR A RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT TO NOT LESS THAN 25 MILES AN HOUR.**

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 28 October 1, 2009.
