## Vehicle Laws - Reduction of Speed Limits by Local Authorities - Engineering and Traffic Investigations

# FOR the purpose of authorizing a county, municipality, or other public body that has the authority to enact laws and adopt local police regulations relating to traffic to decrease a certain maximum speed limit in a business district or a residential district to not less than a certain speed without conducting an engineering and traffic investigation; and generally relating to the reduction of speed limits.
