1 AN ACT concerning

2 Caroline County - Alcoholic Beverages - <u>Special</u> Multiple Event Licenses

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing in Caroline County an applicant to purchase special 4 multiple event alcoholic beverages licenses; specifying certain license fees; 5 prohibiting the total number of days for which special multiple event licenses 6 may be issued to a single applicant from exceeding a certain number of days; 7 requiring that fees for *special* multiple event licenses be paid in advance; prohibiting the Board of License Commissioners from issuing certain refunds 8 under certain circumstances; providing for certain restrictions on the issuance 9 of *special* multiple event licenses; requiring that a certain server be on the 10 11 licensed premises whenever alcoholic beverages are served under the license; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Caroline County. 12

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
