17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19Article Transportation
- 20 21-604.

(a) A person may not turn a vehicle at an intersection, unless the vehicle is
in the position required by § 21-601 of this subtitle.

23 (b) A person may not turn a vehicle to enter a private road or driveway or 24 otherwise turn a vehicle from a direct course or move it right or left on a roadway or

1 from a shoulder or bikeway onto a roadway, unless the movement can be made with 2 reasonable safety.

3 (c) A person may not, if any other vehicle might be affected by the 4 movement, turn a vehicle [until he] OR MOVE IT RIGHT OR LEFT ON A ROADWAY IN 5 ORDER TO CHANGE LANES UNLESS THE PERSON gives an appropriate signal in the 6 manner required by this subtitle.

7 (d) When required, a signal of intention to turn right or left **OR TO CHANGE** 8 **LANES** shall be given continuously during at least the last 100 feet traveled by the 9 vehicle before turning **OR CHANGING LANES**; except that a bicyclist may interrupt 10 the turning signal to maintain control of the bicycle.

11 (e) If there is an opportunity to signal, a person may not stop or suddenly 12 decrease the speed of a vehicle [until he] UNLESS THE PERSON gives an appropriate 13 signal in the manner required by this subtitle to the driver of any other vehicle 14 immediately to the rear.

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(f) The signals provided for in § 21–605(b) and (c) of this subtitle:

16 (1) May be used to indicate an intention to turn, change lanes, or start
 17 from a stopped, standing, or parked position; and

18 (2) May not be flashed as a courtesy or "do pass" signal to the driver of
19 any other vehicle approaching from the rear.

20 21–605.

(a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) of this section, each required
 stop or turn signal shall be given:

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(1) By hand and arm in conformity with § 21–606 of this subtitle; or

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(2) By signal lamps.

25 (b) Each motor vehicle in use on a highway shall be equipped with and the 26 required signal given by signal lamps, if the distance from the center of the top of the 27 steering post to the left outside limit of the body, cab, or load of the vehicle is more 28 than 24 inches.

(c) Each motor vehicle in use on a highway shall be equipped with and the required signal given by signal lamps if, for any vehicle or combination of vehicles, the distance from the center of the top of the steering post to the rear limit of the body or load is more than 14 feet.
