A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore City - Foreign Trade Zones

- FOR the purpose of authorizing Baltimore City to apply for establishing, maintaining,
 and operating foreign trade zones in the Baltimore port of entry and in the
 State of Maryland within a radius of a certain number of miles beyond the port
 of entry limits, and to maintain and operate the foreign trade zones; making
 this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Baltimore Foreign
 Trade Zone.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 16 The Charter of Baltimore City 17 Article II – General Powers 18 The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to 19 exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of 20 Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or 2122such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws: 23

1 To make application for establishing, maintaining and operating foreign trade $\mathbf{2}$ zones in the [Baltimore Harbor] BALTIMORE PORT OF ENTRY AND IN THE STATE 3 OF MARYLAND WITHIN A RADIUS OF 60 MILES BEYOND THE PORT OF ENTRY 4 LIMITS, and to maintain and operate such foreign trade zones when established $\mathbf{5}$ agreeable to and pursuant to the provisions of the Act of the 73rd Congress No. 397, approved June 18, 1934, entitled "A Bill to provide for the establishment, operation 6 and maintenance of Foreign Trade Zones in ports of entry in the United States and to $\mathbf{7}$ expedite and encourage foreign commerce", and any amendment thereof. 8

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 10 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 11 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 12 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 13 the date it is enacted.
