1 (1)The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on $\mathbf{2}$ behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 3 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2009 in the total principal amount of \$1,068,124,000 <u>\$1,108,464,235</u> *\$1,107,793,101*. This loan shall be evidenced by the 4 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution $\mathbf{5}$ 6 of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 7 8 of the Code.

9 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold 10 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

11 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer 12 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and 13 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then 14 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the 15 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable 16 architects' and engineers' fees:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 5 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation 6 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating.
