1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That:

3 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on 4 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 5 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2009 in the total principal amount of 6 \$1,068,124,000 \$1,108,464,235. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and 7 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of 8 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with \$\$ 8–117 through 9 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, \$22 of the Code.

10 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold 11 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

12 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer 13 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and 14 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then 15 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the 16 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable 17 architects' and engineers' fees:
