SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

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23 (a) There is a Maryland Green Building Council.

MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 11 12	[(3)] (4) develop a list of building types for which green building technologies should not be applied, taking into consideration the operational aspects of facilities evaluated, and the utility of a waiver process where appropriate.
13 14 15 16 17	(g) On or before [November 1, 2007, and every year thereafter] <b>NOVEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR</b> , the Council shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, as to recommendations for the implementation plan for a [State] higher performance building program <b>IN THE STATE</b> and any progress that has been made during the preceding year.
