16 17 18 19 20	(g) On or before [November 1, 2007, and every year thereafter] <b>NOVEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR</b> , the Council shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, as to recommendations for the implementation plan for a [State] higher performance building program IN <b>THE STATE</b> and any progress that has been made during the preceding year.
