"Motor scooter" does not include a vehicle that has been manufactured for 4 (b) off-road use, including a motorcycle and an all-terrain vehicle. 5 6 21-1207.1. 7 The provisions of this section apply: (a) (1) 8 (i) At all times while a bicycle **OR A MOTOR SCOOTER** is being operated on any highway, bicycle way, or other property open to the public or used by 9 10 the public for pedestrian or vehicular traffic; and 11 (ii) To a person [under the age of 16] who is riding on a bicycle 12 **OR MOTOR SCOOTER**, including a person [under the age of 16] who is a passenger on 13 a bicycle **OR MOTOR SCOOTER**: 14 1. In a restraining seat attached to the bicycle OR 15 **MOTOR SCOOTER**; or 16 2. In a trailer being towed by the bicycle **OR MOTOR** 17 SCOOTER. 18 (2)The provisions of this section do not apply to passengers in 19 commercial bicycle rickshaws. 20 This section does not apply in the town of Ocean City, Maryland, on the boardwalk between the Ocean City inlet and 27th Street, during the hours in which 21 22bicycles are permitted by local ordinance to be operated on the boardwalk. 23 (c) A person to whom this section applies may not operate or ride as a 24passenger on a bicycle OR MOTOR SCOOTER unless the person is wearing a helmet that meets or exceeds the standards of the American National Standards Institute, the 25 Snell Memorial Foundation's standard, or the standards of the American Society of 26 27 Testing and Measurements for protective headgear for use in bicycling.
 - (d) This section shall be enforced by the issuance of a warning that informs the offender of the requirements of this section and provides educational materials about [bicycle] **PROTECTIVE** helmet use.
