3 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain statewide alert program within the Department of State Police; providing for the purpose of the alert program; 4 5 requiring the Department to adopt guidelines and develop procedures for issuing a certain alert for a certain missing individual; requiring the 6 7 Department to provide training to local law enforcement agencies on the 8 guidelines and procedures to be used to handle a report of a certain missing 9 individual; requiring the Department to provide assistance to a local law 10 enforcement agency as necessary to assist in the safe recovery of certain missing individuals; requiring the Department to recruit certain persons to assist in 11 12 developing and implementing a certain alert program; providing for the 13 construction of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of a Silver Alert Program for missing individuals with cognitive 14 15 impairments.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Public Safety

- 2 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE
- 3 **MEANINGS INDICATED.**
- 4 (2) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE
- 5 POLICE.
- 6 (3) "LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" MEANS A STATE, COUNTY, OR
- 7 MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY, OR A SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT.
- 8 (4) "MENTAL IMPAIRMENT" MEANS A SUBSTANTIAL DISORDER OF
- 9 THOUGHT, MOOD, PERCEPTION, ORIENTATION, OR MEMORY THAT GROSSLY
- 10 IMPAIRS JUDGMENT, BEHAVIOR, OR ABILITY TO LIVE INDEPENDENTLY OR
- 11 PROVIDE SELF-CARE AS CERTIFIED BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, PSYCHIATRIST,

- 13 (B) THERE IS A STATEWIDE SILVER ALERT PROGRAM WITHIN THE

- 15 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE SILVER ALERT PROGRAM IS TO AID IN THE
- 16 IDENTIFICATION AND LOCATION OF ANY INDIVIDUAL:

- 18 (2) WHO IS AT A LOCATION THAT CANNOT BE DETERMINED BY AN
- 19 INDIVIDUAL FAMILIAR WITH THE MISSING INDIVIDUAL;
- 20 (3) WHO IS INCAPABLE OF RETURNING TO THE MISSING
- 21 INDIVIDUAL'S RESIDENCE WITHOUT ASSISTANCE; AND
- 22 (4) WHOSE DISAPPEARANCE, AS DETERMINED BY A LAW
- 23 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY, POSES A CREDIBLE THREAT OF IMMEDIATE DANGER
- 24 OF SERIOUS BODILY HARM OR DEATH TO THE MISSING INDIVIDUAL.
- 25 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:
- 26 (1) ADOPT GUIDELINES AND DEVELOP PROCEDURES FOR THE
- 27 ISSUANCE OF A SILVER ALERT FOR A MISSING INDIVIDUAL;
- 28 (2) PROVIDE TRAINING TO LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES
- 29 ON THE GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A SILVER ALERT

- 4 (4) RECRUIT PUBLIC AND COMMERCIAL TELEVISION AND RADIO 5 BROADCASTERS AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO ASSIST IN 6 DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING A SILVER ALERT.
- 7 (E) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION MAY BE CONSTRUED TO PREVENT THE 8 ACTIVATION OF A LOCAL OR REGIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT PROGRAM THAT 9 MAY IMPOSE DIFFERENT CRITERIA FOR THE ACTIVATION OF A LOCAL OR 10 REGIONAL PLAN.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
