## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 **Gaming – Instant Bingo – Extension of Sunset**

3 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date for the authority for the operation  
4 of certain instant bingo games using electronic machines; ~~repealing a certain~~  
5 ~~obsolete requirement~~; and generally relating to instant bingo operations.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 16 **Article – Criminal Law**

17 12–301.

18 In this subtitle:

19 (1) “slot machine” means a machine, apparatus, or device that:

1 (i) operates or can be made to operate by inserting, depositing,  
2 or placing with another person money, a token, or another object; and

3 (ii) through the element of chance, the reading of a game of  
4 chance, the delivery of a game of chance, or any other outcome unpredictable by the  
5 user, awards the user:

6 1. money, a token, or other object that represents or that  
7 can be converted into money; or

8 2. the right to receive money, a token, or another object  
9 that represents and can be converted into money;

10 (2) "slot machine" includes:

11 (i) a machine, apparatus, or device described in item (1) of this  
12 section that also sells, delivers, or awards merchandise, money, or some other tangible  
13 thing of value; and

14 (ii) a pinball machine or console machine that pays off in  
15 merchandise; and

16 (3) "slot machine" does not include a machine, apparatus, or device  
17 that:

18 (i) awards the user only free additional games or plays;

19 (ii) awards the user only noncash merchandise or noncash  
20 prizes of minimal value;

21 (iii) dispenses paper pull tab tip jar tickets or paper pull tab  
22 instant bingo tickets that must be opened manually by the user provided that the  
23 machine, apparatus, or device does not:

24 1. read the tickets electronically;

25 2. alert the user to a winning or losing ticket; or

26 3. tabulate a player's winnings and losses;

27 (iv) 1. displays facsimiles of bingo cards that users mark and  
28 monitor according to numbers called on the premises by an individual where the user  
29 is operating the machine; and

30 2. does not permit a user to play more than 54 bingo  
31 cards at the same time;

1 (v) is used by the State Lottery Commission under Title 9 of the  
2 State Government Article; or

3 (vi) if legislation takes effect authorizing the operation of video  
4 lottery terminals, is a video lottery terminal as defined in and licensed under that  
5 legislation.

6 **Chapter 474 of the Acts of 2008**

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the  
8 provisions of Section 1 of this Act, an entity licensed to offer instant bingo under a  
9 commercial bingo license as of July 1, 2007, or by a qualified organization as defined in  
10 § 13-201 of this article on the premises of the qualified organization may continue to  
11 operate a game of instant bingo in the same manner using electronic machines until  
12 July 1, [2009] **2011**, provided that:

13 (a) ~~the~~ machines have been in operation for a 1-year period ending  
14 December 31, 2007;

15 (b)~~the~~ the entity does not operate more than the number of electronic machines  
16 operated as of February 28, 2008; and

17 ~~(c) (B)~~ the conduct of the gaming and operation of the machines is  
18 consistent with all other provisions of the Criminal Law Article.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
20 June 1, 2009.
