## Vehicle Laws - Proof of Lawful Presence Act of 2009

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue an 4 identification card or a moped operator's permit to an individual who, in 5 addition to meeting certain other requirements, provides certain documentation 6 certifying that an individual is either a United States citizen or is lawfully 7 present in the United States in accordance with federal law; prohibiting the 8 Administration from issuing a driver's license to an individual who cannot 9 provide certain documentation certifying that the individual is either a United States citizen or is lawfully present in the United States in accordance with 10 11 federal law; providing that the effective term of an identification card, driver's 12 license, or moped operator's permit issued to a certain individual may not 13 exceed the time that the individual is authorized to remain in the United States in accordance with federal law; altering a certain provision that requires a 14 15driver's license application to include a Social Security number to apply only to an applicant who is eligible for a Social Security number; requiring an applicant 16 17for a driver's license who is not eligible for a Social Security number to provide 18 certain documentation to the Administration; requiring an applicant for a 19 driver's license to submit certain documentation with the application; clarifying 20 language; and generally relating to the issuance of driver's licenses, moped operator's permits, and identification cards and proof of lawful presence in the 2122United States.
