- WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 was enacted to promote inclusion, full participation, economic self-sufficiency, and equality of opportunity for all people with disabilities; and
- WHEREAS, In 2000, the United States Census Bureau listed 845,345 people with disabilities out of a total population of 5,296,486 in the State; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Most families are likely to become affected by someone with a 7 disability; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Education, Office of Special Education and 9 Rehabilitative Services reported that, during the fall of 2006, the State served 106,739 10 students with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Act; and
- WHEREAS, Students with disabilities encounter social challenges in academic and community–based activities; and
- WHEREAS, Increasing public awareness of the history of disabilities and the disability rights movement will help to include more fully people with disabilities into society; and
- WHEREAS, Congress has designated October as National Disability Temployment Awareness Month; and
- WHEREAS, Designating October as Disability History and Awareness Month will increase public awareness and respect for people with disabilities in Maryland and beyond; now, therefore,
