#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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#### Criminal Procedure – Reports to "Crime Solvers" Organization – Inadmissibility and Confidentiality

4 FOR the purpose of establishing that evidence of a communication or information  $\mathbf{5}$ contained in the communication between an individual reporting alleged 6 criminal activity to a certain "Crime Solvers" organization and the individual 7 who accepts the report on behalf of the organization is not admissible in a court 8 proceeding; establishing that a law enforcement agency that receives information concerning alleged criminal activity from a certain "Crime Solvers" 9 organization may not disclose the identity of an individual providing 10 information about the criminal activity under a promise of anonymity; defining 11 12a certain term; and generally relating to crime reporting.

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<sup>19</sup> SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1IN THIS SUBTITLE, "CRIME SOLVERS ORGANIZATION" MEANS A PRIVATE,2NONPROFIT MARYLAND ORGANIZATION GOVERNED BY A CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER3BOARD OF DIRECTORS OPERATED ON A LOCAL OR STATEWIDE LEVEL THAT:

4 (1) OFFERS ANONYMITY TO AN INDIVIDUAL PROVIDING 5 INFORMATION TO THE ORGANIZATION;

6 (2) ACCEPTS AND EXPENDS DONATIONS FOR CASH REWARDS TO 7 INDIVIDUALS WHO REPORT TO THE ORGANIZATION INFORMATION ABOUT 8 ALLEGED CRIMINAL ACTIVITY THAT THE ORGANIZATION FORWARDS TO 9 APPROPRIATE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES; AND

10(3) IS ESTABLISHED AS PART OF A COOPERATIVE ALLIANCE11BETWEEN THE NEWS MEDIA, THE COMMUNITY, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT12OFFICIALS.
