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Silver Alert Program - Establishment

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of State Police to establish a Silver Alert Program to disseminate information to assist in locating certain missing persons who suffer certain impairments; requiring the Department to adopt guidelines and develop procedures for issuing a Silver Alert for a certain missing person; requiring the Department to provide training to local law enforcement agencies on the guidelines and procedures to be used to handle a report of a certain missing person; requiring the Department to provide assistance to a local law enforcement agency as necessary to assist in the safe recovery of certain missing persons; requiring the Department to recruit certain persons to assist in developing and implementing the Silver Alert Program; requiring the Department to consult with the State Highway Administration to establish a certain plan for providing information to the public; requiring the Department to consult with the State Board Department of Education to develop a program to allow high school students to assist in the search for a missing person and receive student service credit that meets certain

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2009, contingent on the ability of the Department of State Police to 6 implement the Silver Alert Program with existing budgeted resources and, if the 7 Secretary of State Police determines by July 1, 2009, that the Department of State 8 Police cannot implement the Program with existing budgeted resources, the Secretary 9 shall promptly notify the Executive Director of the Department of Legislative Services 10 of that determination and, upon receipt of that notice, this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly. 11
