1 AN ACT concerning

Texting While Driving Ban of 2009

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting the use of a wireless communication device to write, send, or read a text message while operating a moving motor vehicle; establishing certain exceptions to the prohibition; providing that certain use of a wireless communication device does not constitute writing, sending, or reading a text message for purposes of this Act; and generally relating to the use of a wireless communication device while operating a motor vehicle.

- 26 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the 27 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:
- 28 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other law of this State; or

(2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of 2 the Maryland Vehicle Law.

- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2009.
