- 4 (a) In this section, "vehicle" includes a motor vehicle, streetcar, locomotive, 5 engine, and train.
- 6 (b) A person may not cause the death of another as a result of the person's driving, operating, or controlling a vehicle or vessel in a grossly negligent manner.
- 8 (c) A violation of this section is manslaughter by vehicle or vessel.
- 9 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [10] **30** years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
