Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program; 8 removing the requirement that a student attend a postsecondary institution in 9 the State to be eligible for the Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Summer 10 Internship Scholarship Program; removing the requirement that a student 11 attend a postsecondary institution in the State to use the William Donald Schaefer Scholarship; and generally relating to the Janet L.
