- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and 4 health maintenance organizations, and the State Employee and Retiree Health 5 and Welfare Benefits Program to provide coverage for breast cancer screening in 6 accordance with certain guidelines; repealing certain requirements for coverage 7 of certain mammograms by certain insurance policies and nonprofit health 8 service plans; repealing a certain definition; making certain requirements 9 applicable to health maintenance organizations; making certain conforming changes; providing for the applicability of this Act; and generally relating to 10 health insurance coverage for breast cancer screening. 11
