## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Public Safety – Emergency Management – Essential Goods and Services

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from selling or offering to sell certain goods and services for a certain price during a state of emergency; prohibiting a 4 5 person from selling or offering to sell certain services for a certain price during a state of emergency and for a certain amount of time following a state of 6 7 emergency; creating a certain exception; requiring the Office of the Attorney 8 General to provide a person an opportunity to present evidence that a price 9 increase was not unlawful; providing that a certain sale or offer for sale is an unfair or deceptive trade practice; altering a certain definition; defining certain 10 terms; and generally relating to the sale of goods and services during or 11 following a state of emergency. 12

	(1) a hurricane, tornado, storm, flood, high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, earthquake, landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, drought, fire, explosion, and any other disaster in any part of the State that requires State assistance to supplement local efforts in order to save lives and protect public health and safety; [or]

21 22 23	(B) "BUILDING MATERIALS" MEANS ANY ITEM, OBJECT, OR OTHER THING USED IN THE BUILDING OR REBUILDING OF REAL PROPERTY, INCLUDING LUMBER, CONSTRUCTION TOOLS, AND WINDOWS.
24 25	(C) "CONSUMER GOODS" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 13-101 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE.
26 27	(D) "CONSUMER SERVICES" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 13–101 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE.
28 29 30	(E) "EMERGENCY SUPPLIES" INCLUDES WATER, FLASHLIGHTS, RADIOS, BATTERIES, CANDLES, BLANKETS, SOAP, DIAPERS, TEMPORARY SHELTERS, TAPE, TOILETRIES, PLYWOOD, NAILS, AND HAMMERS.

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1 (F) "ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES" MEANS ANY OF THE 2 FOLLOWING, IF SPECIFIED BY CATEGORY OR BY INDIVIDUAL ITEMS IN AN 3 EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR IN CONNECTION WITH A STATE OF 4 EMERGENCY:

- 5 (1) FOOD ITEMS;
- 6 (2) CONSUMER GOODS AND SERVICES;
- 7 (3) GOODS AND SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP;
- 8 (4) EMERGENCY SUPPLIES;
- 9 (5) MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT;
- 10 (6) HOME HEATING OIL;
- 11 (7) BUILDING MATERIALS;
- 12 (8) HOUSING;
- 13 (9) TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES;
- 14 (10) GASOLINE; OR

15(11) GOODS AND SERVICES NECESSARY TO PRESERVE THE16HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.

17 (G) "FOOD ITEM" MEANS ANY ARTICLE THAT IS USED OR INTENDED FOR
 18 USE FOR FOOD OR DRINK.

19(H) "FUEL" MEANS GASOLINE, DIESEL, OR OTHER FUEL USED TO20POWER A MOTOR VEHICLE OR POWER TOOL.

21 (I) (1) "HOUSING" MEANS RENTAL HOUSING.

(2) "HOUSING" INCLUDES HOUSING PROVIDED BY A HOTEL OR
 MOTEL.

(J) "MEDICAL SUPPLIES OR EQUIPMENT" INCLUDES PRESCRIPTION
 AND NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS, VACCINES, BANDAGES, GAUZE,
 ISOPROPYL ALCOHOL, MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, ANTIVIRAL PRODUCTS, AND
 ANTIBACTERIAL PRODUCTS.

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(K) "PRICE" MEANS RETAIL OR WHOLESALE PRICE.

(L) "REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES" MEANS SERVICES
PERFORMED BY A PERSON FOR REPAIRS TO RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL
PROPERTY THAT IS DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF A DISASTER OR TERRORIST
ATTACK.

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(M) "REPLACEMENT COSTS" MEANS:

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(1) ACQUISITION COSTS;

8 (2) COSTS THAT ARE A RESULT OF A CONTRACT IN WHICH THE 9 CONSUMER GOODS AND SERVICES ARE PRICED ACCORDING TO A FORMULA 10 THAT REFERENCES PUBLISHED MARKET PRICES; OR

11(3) THE ACTUAL OR REASONABLY CONTEMPLATED COSTS OF12REPLACING A GOOD OR SERVICE BEING SOLD, BASED ON INFORMATION13AVAILABLE AT THE TIME OF THE INCREASE IN PRICE.

14(n) "STATE OF EMERGENCY" MEANS A STATE OF EMERGENCY15DECLARED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER § 14–107 OF THIS TITLE.

16 (O) "TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES" MEANS
 17 SERVICES PERFORMED BY A PERSON UNDER A CONTRACT TO MOVE, STORE, OR
 18 TRANSPORT PERSONAL OR BUSINESS PROPERTY OR RENT EQUIPMENT FOR
 19 THOSE PURPOSES.

21EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, (A) 22DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY, IN THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA COVERED BY THE 23DECLARATION OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR 24OFFER TO SELL ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES SPECIFIED BY EXECUTIVE 25ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR, OTHER THAN SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY 26CLEANUP, FOR A PRICE OF MORE THAN 20% ABOVE THE HIGHEST PRICE AT 27WHICH THE PERSON MADE ACTUAL SALES OR RENTALS OF THOSE ESSENTIAL GOODS OR SERVICES NOT MORE THAN 60 DAYS OR LESS THAN 4 DAYS BEFORE 2829 THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

(B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION,
 DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY, AND FOR THE FOLLOWING 90 DAYS, A PERSON
 MAY NOT SELL OR OFFER TO SELL REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR
 SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP FOR A PRICE OF MORE THAN 20%

1 ABOVE THE PRICE CHARGED BY THE PERSON FOR THOSE SERVICES 2 IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

3 (C) A PERSON MAY CHARGE A PRICE INCREASE OF MORE THAN 20% IF
 4 THE PERSON CAN PROVE THAT:

5 (1) THE PRICE INCREASE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO
6 ADDITIONAL COSTS IMPOSED ON THE PERSON BY THE SUPPLIER OF THE GOODS,
7 INCLUDING REPLACEMENT COSTS; OR

8 (2) THE PRICE INCREASE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO 9 ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR LABOR OR MATERIALS USED TO PROVIDE THE 10 SERVICES OR TO PRODUCE THE GOODS, INCLUDING COSTS TO REPAIR ANY 11 DAMAGE RELATING TO THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

12 (D) AT LEAST 10 DAYS BEFORE AN ACTION IS FILED UNDER § 14–1103 13 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL PROVIDE A 14 PERSON WHOSE ACTIONS MAY BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION NOTICE OF 15 THE GENERAL RELIEF SOUGHT BY THE OFFICE TO PROVIDE THE PERSON AN 16 OPPORTUNITY TO PRESENT EVIDENCE THAT THE PRICE INCREASE WAS IN 17 ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

19A SALE OR OFFER FOR SALE OF ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES THAT20VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS AN UNFAIR OR DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE21UNDER TITLE 13 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE, EXCEPT THAT THE22REMEDIES PROVIDED UNDER § 13-411 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE23MAY NOT APPLY TO A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.

THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH A
 SYSTEM BY WHICH A PERSON MAY REGISTER TO RECEIVE ELECTRONIC
 NOTIFICATION:

28 (1) STATING THAT A STATE OF EMERGENCY HAS BEEN DECLARED
 29 AND AN EXECUTIVE ORDER HAS BEEN ISSUED;

30(2)STATING THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE ARE IN31EFFECT; AND

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1 (3) LISTING THE CATEGORIES OR INDIVIDUAL ESSENTIAL GOODS 2 AND SERVICES THAT ARE COVERED BY THE EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE 3 GOVERNOR.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2009.
