- (II) A BALTIMORE COUNTY EMERGENCY VEHICLE WITH A GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT OF 47,000 POUNDS OR MORE SHALL BE EQUIPPED WITH A MOTOR-DRIVEN MECHANICAL SIREN THAT EMITS A MINIMUM OF 123 DECIBELS OF A SQUARE WAVE WARNING SOUND.
- 8 (2) However, the siren may not be used except when the vehicle is 9 operated in response to an emergency call or in the immediate pursuit of an actual or 10 suspected violator of the law, in which latter events the driver of the vehicle shall 11 sound the siren when reasonably necessary to warn pedestrians and other drivers of 12 the approach of the vehicle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
