18	1. ILLNESS;
19	2. FAMILY EMERGENCIES;

23 24	(ii) An excused absence under this paragraph may not be considered an absence for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this subsection.
25 26 27	(3) (i) Any elected or Governor–appointed trustee that fails to attend at least 80% of the meetings, not including excused absences under paragraph (2) of this subsection, shall be removed from the Board of Trustees by the Governor.
