# 1 AN ACT concerning

# State Retirement and Pension System - Board of Trustees - Attendance and Educational Training

4 FOR the purpose of providing additional exceptions for excused absences from certain 5 meetings for members of the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and 6 Pension System; altering the limitation on the location where the Board of 7 Trustees may meet for certain training; removing certain limitations regarding 8 certain entities who may conduct certain training for the Board of Trustees 9 requiring certain trustees on the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System to use certain leave when attending certain meetings of the 10 Board of Trustees; requiring the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to approve 11 certain training to satisfy a certain requirement; requiring the State Retirement 12 13 Agency to submit certain reports on or before a certain date to the Joint Committee on Pensions; and generally relating to trustee attendance and 14

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
