4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a public service company from terminating electric or gas service to a residential customer in a certain area because of nonpayment on 5 6 a day for which the forecasted high temperature in the area is at or below a 7 certain temperature; prohibiting a public service company from terminating electric service to a residential customer in a certain area because of 8 9 nonpayment on certain days if a day for which the forecasted heat index temperature in the area is at or above a certain level; temperature; requiring 10 the Public Service Commission to require certain public service companies to 11 designate certain weather station areas for certain purposes; providing for the 12 construction of this Act; requiring the Public Service Commission to adopt 13 regulations to carry out this Act; and generally relating to public service 14 companies and the termination of electric and gas service to residential 15 16 customers.
