FOR the purpose of altering the membership of a certain review committee charged

employees; clarifying certain methods by which certain ideas may be received by
a certain review committee; providing that certain heads of principal units of
State government consult with a certain review committee before submitting
certain ideas to the Governor's Award Panel; and generally relating to the
review and evaluation process of incentive awards for State personnel.
