1 AN ACT concerning

2 School Construction - Pedestrian and Bicycle Trail Enhancements - Funding

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Public Works to include certain pedestrian 4 and bicycle trail enhancements as an approved public school construction or 5 capital improvement cost; defining a certain term; requiring the Board to adopt 6 certain regulations; limiting the aggregate amount that the Board may approve 7 in any fiscal year for the construction of certain pedestrian and bicycle trail 8 enhancements as part of a public school construction or public school capital 9 improvement; authorizing local governments to use certain highway user 10 revenues for sidewalk construction; stating a certain policy of the State with 11 regard to sidewalks, footpaths, and bicycle trails; including sidewalks under certain provisions governing the construction of certain footpaths and trails by 12 local governments; and generally relating to the use of public school 13 14 construction aid and certain highway user revenues for pedestrian and bicycle 15 trail enhancements.

7 8 9 10 11	(a) (1) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "TRANSPORTATION SERVICES" INCLUDES SIDEWALKS, FOOTPATHS, BICYCLE TRAILS, CROSSING LIGHTS, CROSSING GUARDS, AND OTHER CAPITAL AND OPERATING INVESTMENTS THAT FACILITATE AND ENCOURAGE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS TO WALK OR BIKE TO SCHOOL SAFELY.
12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22	(2) The State shall distribute grants as provided under this section to the county boards to provide transportation services for public school students and disabled children for whom transportation is to be provided under § 8–410 of this article. Appropriations for student transportation shall be budgeted in a separate budget category as provided in § 5–101 of this title. If the amount that is appropriated to a county under this section in a fiscal year is more than the actual cost of providing student transportation services in that county, a county board may apply any excess funds to costs of pupil transportation in subsequent years. 24 25 26	(b) (1) For the purposes of this section other than subsection (c), the Board of Public Works shall define by regulation what constitutes an eligible and ineligible public school construction or capital improvement cost.

11	(a) It is the policy of this State that:
12 13	(1) [bicycle] BICYCLE trails are important and their construction is encouraged wherever feasible; AND
14 15 16 17	(2) SIDEWALKS, FOOTPATHS, AND BICYCLE TRAILS ARE CRITICALLY IMPORTANT TO FACILITATE AND ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO WALK OR BIKE TO SCHOOL SAFELY AND THEIR CONSTRUCTION IS ENCOURAGED WHEREVER FEASIBLE.
18 19	(b) To establish and maintain SIDEWALKS , footpaths, bridle paths or horse trails, and bicycle trails:
20 21 22	(1) Baltimore City, any county, or any municipality that receives highway user revenues may spend a reasonable part of its net share for these purposes; and
23 24 25	(2) The Administration, Baltimore City, any county, or any municipality that receives highway user revenues may credit a part of them to a financial reserve or a special fund to be used within 10 years for these purposes.
26 27	(c) Highway user revenues may not be used for SIDEWALKS , footpaths, bridle paths or horse trails, or bicycle trails if:
28	(1) Their establishment would be contrary to public safety;
29 30	(2) Their cost would be too great considering their need or probable use; or
31 32	(3) The sparseness of population, the existence of other available ways, or other factors show that there is no need for them.

1 (d) (1) If requested by a local government, the Administration shall provide technical assistance and advice on carrying out the purposes of this section.

- (2) The Administration shall recommend construction standards for **SIDEWALKS**, footpaths, bridle paths or horse trails, and bicycle trails and shall establish a uniform system of signs for all the **SIDEWALKS**, footpaths, bridle paths or horse trails, and bicycle trails constructed under this section, whether construction is undertaken by the Administration or by the local government.
- (e) Unless the Administration or local government specifically approves other uses, as provided in subsection (g) of this section, [footpaths] **SIDEWALKS**, **FOOTPATHS**, and bicycle trails may be used only by pedestrians, nonmotorized vehicles, and electric personal assistive mobility devices as defined in § 21–101(j) of this article.
- 13 (f) Unless the Administration or local government specifically approves 14 other uses, as provided in subsection (g) of this section, bridle paths or horse trails 15 may be used only by pedestrians, horses, or horse drawn vehicles.
 - (g) If the Administration or local government specifically approves the use of [footpaths] **SIDEWALKS, FOOTPATHS,** and bicycle trails by other than pedestrians and nonmotorized vehicles, or of bridle paths or horse trails by other than pedestrians, horses, or horse drawn vehicles, the Administration or local government shall post signs on the paths or trails indicating the uses specifically approved.
 - (h) A person may not operate a moped on a **SIDEWALK**, footpath, bicycle trail, bridle path, or horse trail unless the [path] **SIDEWALK**, **PATH**, or trail is posted with signs in accordance with subsection (g) of this section specifically approving the use of mopeds.
- 25 (i) Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, the use of [footpaths] 26 **SIDEWALKS, FOOTPATHS,** and bicycle trails shall be denied to sports cycles, trail bikes, and minibikes.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
