A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Health - Maryland Commission on Autism

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Commission on Autism; providing for the membership of the Commission; requiring the membership of the 4 5 Commission to consist of broad representation of the State's citizens; 6 designating the chair of the Commission; establishing a quorum requirement; 7 requiring the Commission to meet a certain number of times per year; requiring 8 the Commission to meet a certain number of times before a certain date; 9 authorizing the Commission to hold meetings in a certain manner; prohibiting a 10 member of the Commission from receiving compensation; authorizing a member of the Commission to receive certain reimbursement; requiring a certain person 11 12 to designate certain staff for the Commission; requiring the Commission to 13 make certain recommendations; requiring the Commission to make a certain 14 evaluation; requiring the Commission to carry out certain tasks in preparing a 15certain plan; authorizing the Commission to undertake certain responsibilities; requiring the Commission to report to the General Assembly on or before 16 17certain dates; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; 18 and generally relating to autism awareness.

7 (2) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2012, ON THE COMMISSION'S
8 FINAL FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT OF
9 A COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE PLAN UNDER § 13–2805 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2009. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of 12 September 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 13 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
