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## **Health - Maryland Commission on Autism**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Commission on Autism; providing for 4 the membership of the Commission; requiring the membership of the 5 Commission to consist of broad representation of the State's citizens; 6 designating the chair of the Commission; establishing a quorum requirement; 7 requiring the Commission to meet a certain number of times per year; requiring 8 the Commission to meet a certain number of times before a certain date; 9 authorizing the Commission to hold meetings in a certain manner; prohibiting a 10 member of the Commission from receiving compensation; authorizing a member 11 of the Commission to receive certain reimbursement; requiring a certain person 12 to designate requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the State Department of Education to provide certain staff for the Commission; 13 requiring the Commission to make certain recommendations; requiring the 14 Commission to make a certain evaluation; requiring the Commission to carry 15 out certain tasks in preparing a certain plan; authorizing the Commission to 16 17 undertake certain responsibilities; requiring the Commission to report to the 18 General Assembly on or before certain dates; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to autism awareness. 19
