BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16 **Article - Criminal Law** 17 11-303. 18 A person may not knowingly: (a) (1)19 (i) take or cause another to be taken to any place for 20 prostitution; 21place, cause to be placed, or harbor another in any place for (ii) 22 prostitution;

A person who violates subsection (a) of this section is subject 18 (ii) to § 5–106(b) of the Courts Article. 19 20 (2)A person who violates subsection (b) of this section is guilty of the 21felony of human trafficking and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 22 25 years or a fine not exceeding \$15,000 or both. 23(d) A person who violates this section may be charged, tried, and sentenced in any county in or through which the person transported or attempted to transport 24 25the other.
