## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Hate Crimes – Civil Remedy**

3 FOR the purpose of providing that a person who is aggrieved by a violation of certain  
4 hate crime laws may bring a civil action against a certain person; authorizing  
5 the court to impose an injunction and award certain damages; providing for the  
6 application of this Act; and generally relating to the right to file a civil action for  
7 a hate crime.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Criminal Law**

16 **10–309.**

17 (A) **A PERSON WHO IS AGGRIEVED BY A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE**  
18 **MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST THE PERSON OR PERSONS WHO**  
19 **COMMITTED THE VIOLATION IN A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION.**

20 (B) **THE COURT MAY:**

21 (1) **ISSUE AN INJUNCTION TO PREVENT OR RESTRAIN A**  
22 **VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

3                   **(C)    (1)    DAMAGES AWARDED BY A COURT UNDER THIS SECTION MAY**  
4 **INCLUDE:**

5                               **(I)    ECONOMIC DAMAGES AND ANY OTHER PECUNIARY LOSS**  
6 **SUSTAINED BY THE PLAINTIFF THAT WAS PROXIMATELY CAUSED BY THE**  
7 **VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

8                               **(II)   NONECONOMIC DAMAGES, INCLUDING:**

- 9                                       **1.    PAIN AND SUFFERING;**
- 10                                      **2.    EMOTIONAL DISTRESS;**
- 11                                      **3.    MENTAL ANGUISH;**
- 12                                      **4.    LOSS OF ENJOYMENT;**
- 13                                      **5.    LOSS OF COMPANIONSHIP, SERVICES, AND**  
14 **CONSORTIUM; AND**
- 15                                      **6.    OTHER NONPECUNIARY LOSS SUSTAINED BY THE**  
16 **PLAINTIFF THAT WAS PROXIMATELY CAUSED BY THE VIOLATION OF THIS**

19                   **(2)    THE COURT MAY ALSO AWARD REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S**  
20 **FEEES TO THE PREVAILING PARTY.**

21                   **(D)    THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT ANY LEGAL OR EQUITABLE RIGHT**  
22 **OR REMEDY OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW.**

23                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be  
24 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have  
25 any effect on or application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of  
26 this Act.

27                   SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
28 October 1, 2009.
