A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Procedure – State Commission on Criminal Sentencing Policy –**
3 **Reconsideration of Sentence**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a judge or the judge’s designee, within a certain period
5 of time after ruling on a motion to revise, modify, or reduce the sentence
6 imposed on a defendant for a certain crime of violence, to complete a Maryland
7 sentencing guidelines worksheet reflecting the ruling, and to submit a copy of
8 the completed worksheet to the State Commission on Criminal Sentencing
9 Policy; requiring the Administrative Office of the Courts to adopt regulations to
10 implement this Act on or before a certain date; and generally relating to
11 criminal sentencing policy.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

20 6–207.

21 (A) Each State unit and local governmental unit shall cooperate with the
22 Commission.

23 (B) (1) **WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RULING ON A MOTION TO REVISE,**
24 **MODIFY, OR REDUCE THE SENTENCE IMPOSED ON A DEFENDANT FOR A CRIME**

1 OF VIOLENCE AS DEFINED IN § 14-101 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, THE
2 RULING JUDGE OR THE JUDGE'S DESIGNEE SHALL:

3 (I) COMPLETE A MARYLAND SENTENCING GUIDELINES
4 WORKSHEET FOR THE CASE REFLECTING THE RULING; AND

5 (II) SUBMIT THE COMPLETED WORKSHEET TO THE
6 COMMISSION.

7 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2010, THE ADMINISTRATIVE
8 OFFICE OF THE COURTS SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS
9 SUBSECTION.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2009.
