A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Family Law - Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System for Child Care Programs

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to establish the Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System (QRIS); establishing 5 certain requirements for the Maryland QRIS; clarifying the purpose of the 6 7 Maryland QRIS; requiring the Department to use existing State and federal 8 resources to fund the Maryland QRIS; authorizing the use of certain funds for 9 certain purposes; requiring the Department to select an independent party to evaluate the validity and reliability of the Maryland QRIS; requiring the 10 Department to provide certain information to the public on child care programs 11 12 evaluated by the Maryland QRIS; requiring the Department to reduce unannounced visits to certain child care programs under certain circumstances; 13 authorizing the Department to adopt regulations to implement this Act; 14 requiring the Department to submit a certain report to the Governor and 15General Assembly each year; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 16 17the Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System for child care programs. 18

25 WHEREAS, Recent brain research confirms that the most rapid brain growth 26 occurs in the first 5 years of life; and

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1 WHEREAS, High-quality early care and education programs make a significant 2 contribution to the development of skills required by young children to succeed in 3 schools; and

- 4 WHEREAS, Not all Maryland children have access to quality early care and 5 education programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Parents who purchase child care services are entitled to receive 7 information about the quality of child care; and

8 WHEREAS, The State Department of Education has oversight of all licensed 9 and registered child care programs; and

10 WHEREAS, Maryland has numerous systems that support early care and 11 education programs, including the Early Childhood Accreditation Program, the 12 Maryland Child Care Credential Program, and the Tiered Reimbursement Program; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, Seventeen states have established a Quality Ratings and 15 Improvement System (QRIS) to identify the level of quality among licensed and 16 registered child care providers; now, therefore,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Family Law

21 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 22 MEANINGS INDICATED.

(2) "EARLY CHILDHOOD ACCREDITATION PROGRAM" MEANS A
 PROGRAM THAT ASSESSES A FACILITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH COMAR
 13A.14.09.

(3) "LEVELS OF QUALITY" MEANS AWARDS GIVEN TO A LICENSED
 OR REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE PROGRAM THAT HAS MET QUALITY CRITERIA
 ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SECTION.

(4) "LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTER" MEANS A CHILD CARE
 CENTER THAT RECEIVED A LICENSE FROM THE DEPARTMENT UNDER § 5–574
 OF THIS SUBTITLE, WHICH GIVES PERMISSION TO OPERATE A CHILD CARE
 CENTER, IN ACCORDANCE WITH COMAR 13A.16.01.

1 (5) "MARYLAND CHILD CARE CREDENTIAL PROGRAM" MEANS 2 THE PROGRAM OPERATED BY THE DEPARTMENT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH 3 COMAR 13A.14.09.

4 (6) "MARYLAND QUALITY RATINGS AND IMPROVEMENT SYSTEM" 5 MEANS THE PROCESS BY WHICH AWARDS OF QUALITY RATINGS ARE GIVEN TO 6 LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTERS AND REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE 7 PROVIDERS AS DEFINED IN COMAR 13A.14.09.

- 8 (7) "REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE" MEANS ANY FAMILY DAY 9 CARE AS DEFINED IN § 5–501 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 10(8) "TIERED REIMBURSEMENT" MEANS WEEKLY PAYMENTS IN11ACCORDANCE WITH COMAR 13A.14.06.
- (B) (1) (I) THERE IS A MARYLAND QUALITY RATINGS AND
 IMPROVEMENT SYSTEM (QRIS) FOR ALL LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTERS AND
 REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE PROVIDERS.
- 15 (II) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH THE MARYLAND
 16 QRIS ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2011.
- 17(2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DETERMINE FIVE LEVELS OF18QUALITY FOR THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 19(3) THE MARYLAND QRIS SHALL INCLUDE, AT A MINIMUM, AN20EVALUATION OF THE FOLLOWING COMPONENTS:
- 21**(I)** LICENSING STATUS AND COMPLIANCE; 22**(II)** LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS; 23(III) PROGRAM EVALUATIONS; 24(IV) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT; 25(V) **ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES;** 26 (VI) PARENT AND FAMILY INVOLVEMENT; AND $\mathbf{27}$ (VII) ASSESSMENT OF CHILD GROWTH AND LEARNING.

1 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE MARYLAND QRIS IS TO PROMOTE SCHOOL 2 READINESS BY ESTABLISHING A SYSTEM TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF ALL 3 LICENSED AND REGISTERED CHILD CARE PROVIDERS IN THE STATE. 4 **(D)** (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE EXISTING STATE AND $\mathbf{5}$ FEDERAL RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM AND TO IMPLEMENT A 6 STATEWIDE EXPANSION OF THE MARYLAND QRIS. 7 (2) FUNDS THAT ARE USED FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 8 MARYLAND QRIS MAY BE USED TO: 9 **(I)** IMPROVE THE COMPLIANCE RATES OF CHILD CARE 10 FACILITIES; 11 (II) ESTABLISH A METHODOLOGY TO EVALUATE QUALITY 12**LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS:** 13(III) EXPAND THE NUMBER OF CHILD CARE PROGRAMS 14 **OBTAINING STATE OR NATIONAL PROGRAM ACCREDITATION;** 15(IV) EXPAND THE NUMBER OF CHILD CARE PROVIDERS 16 RECEIVING QUALITY PROFESSIONAL **DEVELOPMENT**, **INCLUDING** 17POSTSECONDARY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION; AND 18 **(V)** EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS, INCLUDING VALIDITY 19 AND RELIABILITY, OF THE MARYLAND QRIS. 20THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT AN INDEPENDENT PARTY TO **(E)** 21EVALUATE THE VALIDITY AND RELIABILITY OF THE MARYLAND QRIS. 22THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC **(F)** 23ON THE EVALUATION AND RATING OF ALL LICENSED AND REGISTERED CHILD CARE PROGRAMS WITHIN THE MARYLAND QRIS. 2425THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REDUCE THE NUMBER OF UNANNOUNCED (G) 26MONITORING VISITS FROM ONE VISIT ANNUALLY TO ONE VISIT EVERY 2 YEARS 27TO ANY LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTER OR REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE 28THAT HAS REACHED, AT A MINIMUM, LEVEL 3 OF THE 5-LEVEL MARYLAND 29 **QRIS**.

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30(H)THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE31REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

1 (I) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT 2 SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF 3 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE 4 PROGRESS OF THE MARYLAND QRIS.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2009.
