Conroy Tuition Waiver Program that provides a 5 certain waiver of tuition and mandatory fees at public institutions of higher 6 7 education in the State for certain members of the armed forces, prisoners of 8 war, public safety employees, veterans, and certain spouses and children; providing a certain waiver of tuition and mandatory fees for certain survivors of 9 Maryland residents killed in certain terrorist attacks; exempting a recipient 10 from repaying certain amounts; providing for the duration of the waiver; 11 defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of the 12 Edward T.
