Conroy Tuition Waiver Program that provides a 5 6 certain waiver of tuition and mandatory fees at public institutions of higher 7 education in the State for certain members of the armed forces, prisoners of war, public safety employees, veterans, and certain spouses and children; 8 9 providing a certain waiver of tuition and mandatory fees for certain survivors of Maryland residents killed in certain terrorist attacks; exempting a recipient 10 from repaying certain amounts; providing for the duration of the waiver; 11 defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of the 12 Edward T. Conroy Tuition Waiver Program. authorizing certain persons to 13 apply to certain postsecondary institutions for the Edward T.
