CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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State Personnel - At-Will Employment - Reforms and Reports

FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law that designate certain positions and employees as being in the executive service or management service or as special appointments in the State Personnel Management System; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to designate management service positions in the System that must be filled without regard to certain criteria and that may be filled with regard to certain criteria; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to provide certain information to the Governor and the General Assembly on certain management service positions; providing that certain management service positions may be filled with regard to certain criteria; altering the criteria for designating certain positions in the professional service; altering the criteria for designating certain positions in the management service; repealing a provision of law that designates individuals in certain positions in the management service or the executive service as special appointments; excluding from the scope of certain provisions of law governing appointments in the skilled service and the professional service the recruitment for and the appointment to a professional service position position in the skilled service or professional service under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations relating to the recruitment for and appointment to certain positions; altering the circumstances under which an appointing authority may select a candidate for a certain position by recruitment; repealing a certain obsolete provision relating to certain professional assistants; repealing a certain requirement that certain employees in certain demonstration sites be in the management service or a special
