2 Consolidated Transportation Program – Traffic Congestion Reporting

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Transportation to include a report 4 section in the annual Consolidated Transportation Program on efforts $\mathbf{5}$ describing activities by the Department and the Maryland Transportation 6 Authority to address traffic congestion; requiring the report section to include 7 measures activities that should may be implemented by other State agencies or 8 local governments to reduce traffic congestion and travel demand and enhance 9 mobility throughout the State; requiring the report section to include the 10 anticipated effect that new capital projects that have an identified purpose of reducing congestion will have on traffic congestion and mobility in the State; 11 12 and generally relating to traffic congestion in the State.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
