14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Commercial Law

(a) In addition to any action by the Division or Attorney General authorized
 by this title and any other action otherwise authorized by law, any person may bring
 an action to recover for injury or loss sustained by [him] THE PERSON as the result of
 a practice prohibited by this title.

1(1)STATUTORY DAMAGES IN AN AMOUNT NOT LESS THAN \$5002OR MORE THAN \$5,000; AND

3 (2) IF THE COURT FINDS THAT THE DEFENDANT WILLFULLY OR 4 KNOWINGLY VIOLATED A PROVISION OF THIS TITLE, DAMAGES IN AN AMOUNT 5 EQUAL TO THREE TIMES THE AMOUNT OF ACTUAL DAMAGES AWARDED.

6 [(b)] (C) Any person who brings an action to recover for injury or loss under 7 this section and who is awarded damages may also seek, and the court may award, 8 reasonable attorney's fees.

9 [(c)] (D) If it appears to the satisfaction of the court, at any time, that an 10 action is brought in bad faith or is of a frivolous nature, the court may order the 11 offending party to pay to the other party reasonable attorney's fees.

12 [(d)] (E) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a person may 13 not bring an action under this section to recover for injuries sustained as a result of 14 the professional services provided by a health care provider, as defined in § 3–2A–01 of 15 the Courts Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2009.
