12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Finance and Procurement

- 16 (a) In this section, "Fund" means the Undeliverable Checks Fund.
- 17 (b) There is an Undeliverable Checks Fund.
- (c) If a check that the Treasurer, the Chief Deputy Treasurer, or a deputy
 treasurer issues is returned to the Comptroller as undeliverable, the Comptroller:

(1) shall keep the check for a period of not more than 30 days;

$\begin{array}{c} 13\\14\end{array}$	(f) As required by State or federal law, or as considered proper by the Treasurer, the Treasurer, the Chief Deputy Treasurer, or a deputy treasurer shall:
$\begin{array}{c} 15\\ 16 \end{array}$	(1) on a warrant charged against the Fund, disburse to the original source any money in the Fund required to be returned to the source; or
17 18	(2) request the Comptroller to transfer any money in the Fund to another fund or account.

28 29	(h) Undeliverable checks credited to the Fund are not subject to Title 17 of the Commercial Law Article.
30 31 32 33	(I) NOTWITHSTANDING § 10–617 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AT THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE TREASURER MAY ELECTRONICALLY PUBLISH ON THE TREASURER'S WEBSITE THE NAMES OF PAYEES OF CHECKS THAT HAVE REMAINED UNCLAIMED FOR 2 YEARS OR MORE.
