A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Vehicle Laws - All-Terrain Vehicles - Safety Standards and Training

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Board, in 4 accordance with certain provisions of this Act, to establish criteria for all-terrain vehicle safety programs, approve qualifying programs, and adopt 5 6 certain regulations; prohibiting individuals under a certain age from operating 7 or riding on an all-terrain vehicle; establishing certain prohibitions related to 8 the operation of all-terrain vehicles of certain sizes by individuals of certain 9 ages; prohibiting an individual under a certain age from operating an 10 all-terrain vehicle unless certain requirements related to all-terrain vehicle safety training are met; prohibiting an individual who is not an experienced 11 all-terrain vehicle operator by a certain date from operating an all-terrain 12 vehicle unless certain requirements related to all-terrain vehicle safety training 13 14 are met; prohibiting an individual who is an experienced all-terrain vehicle 15operator by a certain date from operating an all-terrain vehicle unless certain 16 requirements related to all-terrain vehicle safety training are met or unless the individual carries a certain card certifying that the individual is an experienced 17all-terrain vehicle operator; providing that a passenger may ride only on an 18 19 all-terrain vehicle that is intended by the manufacturer for use by an operator 20 and a passenger; providing that no more than one passenger may ride on an 21all-terrain vehicle; defining certain terms; and generally relating to safety 22standards and training for all-terrain vehicles.
