BY adding to Article – Agriculture Section 2–315.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2007 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Agriculture 2-315.1.
