- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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Article - Criminal Law

16 10–107.

17 (a) This section does not apply to the distribution of a coupon that is 18 redeemable for a tobacco product, if the coupon is:

(1) contained in a newspaper, magazine, or other type of publication in
which the coupon is incidental to the primary purpose of the publication; or

21 (2) sent through the mail.

22 (b) (1) This subsection does not apply to the distribution of a tobacco 23 product or tobacco paraphernalia to a minor who is acting solely as the agent of the



1 minor's employer if the employer distributes tobacco products or tobacco 2 paraphernalia for commercial purposes.

3 (2) A person who distributes tobacco products for commercial 4 purposes, including a person licensed under Title 16 of the Business Regulation 5 Article, may not distribute to a minor:

6 (i) a tobacco product;

(1)

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- (ii) tobacco paraphernalia; or
- 8 (iii) a coupon redeemable for a tobacco product.
- 9 (c) A person not described in subsection (b)(2) of this section may not:
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 - (1) purchase for or sell a tobacco product to a minor; or
- 11 (2) distribute tobacco paraphernalia to a minor.

12 (d) In a prosecution for a violation of this section, it is a defense that the 13 defendant examined the purchaser's or recipient's driver's license or other valid 14 identification issued by an employer, government unit, or institution of higher 15 education that positively identified the purchaser or recipient as at least 18 years of 16 age.

17 (e) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on 18 conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding:

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[\$300] **\$700** for a first violation;

20 (2) [\$1,000] **\$2,000** for a second violation occurring within 2 years 21 after the first violation; and

(3) [\$3,000] \$5,000 for each subsequent violation occurring within 2
 years after the preceding violation.

24 (f) For purposes of this section, each separate incident at a different time 25 and occasion is a violation.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 October 1, 2009.

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
